

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Duke Summer Session on-campus courses have been cancelled for Term 1 of 2020. We are, however, working on a set of online courses that will replace, and hopefully expand, summer offerings. For students already registered in Summer 1 courses, we have not formally cancelled your enrollment because if an online course will be offered, we will move you into the new online class. If you then choose to cancel, that is fine.

The university will make a decision about face-to-face classes for Summer Term 2 by the end of April. Regardless, we are moving forward with organizing a robust set of online courses for Summer 2.

At this time we are working with faculty and departments to ensure the smooth transition of existing summer courses to an online format. We are also reviewing proposals for a broader selection of additional offerings across subject areas.

Additionally, please note the following:

- 1) Many of the courses scheduled for Term 1 will be offered in an online format. Unfortunately, at this time, we cannot guarantee that all will be offered.
- 2) If you are currently registered for a Term 1 course and you know you do NOT want to take an online version, please drop the course.
- 3) If you DO want to take an online version of the course, please remain in the course if you are already registered; or add the course. Please also get on waitlists for courses of interest that are already full. Waitlists enable us to assess demand and adjust accordingly.
- 4) We will have a revised course schedule for Summer Term 1 posted by April 20. If we have updates to Summer 2 by then, we will post those changes as well. The schedule will include both the existing courses in the online format, as well as new additions to the summer course list. Please check: <https://summersession.duke.edu/duke-students/courses>.
- 5) We expect to have a fully revised course schedule for Term 2 posted by no later than May 8.
- 6) You will have opportunities to adjust your schedule once the revised course schedules are posted.
- 7) Information regarding summer term grading, maximum summer course credits and tuition will be available very soon.
